

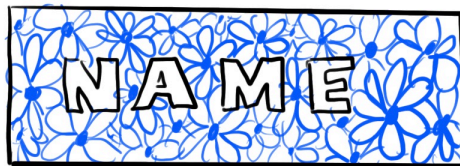
Make a name for yourself ☆



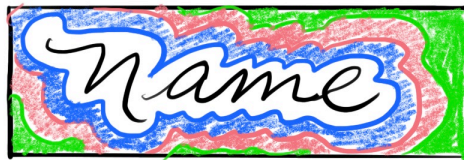
Use your name to make a piece of art.

OPTIONS:

- Draw your name in block letters, then doodle or color around it.



- Draw your name like you normally would, then draw bubbles around it.



MORE OPTIONS

- Use a gradation*

(gradual change in hue or value.)

hue = color → i.e., changing from Yellow to Red.



value = shades of light or dark → i.e.,
white to black; pale pink to deep violet.



* In fashion and hair styling,
this effect is sometimes
referred to as OMBRE.

(AHM-bray)

MATERIALS

- Pencil or Pen & Paper
- Water color
- Acrylic on Panel or Canvas Board
- Markers
- Crayons
- Sidewalk Chalk
- Leaves + Sticks

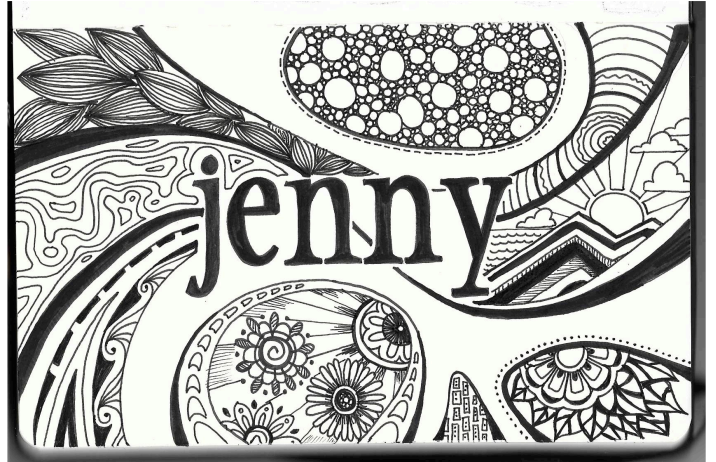
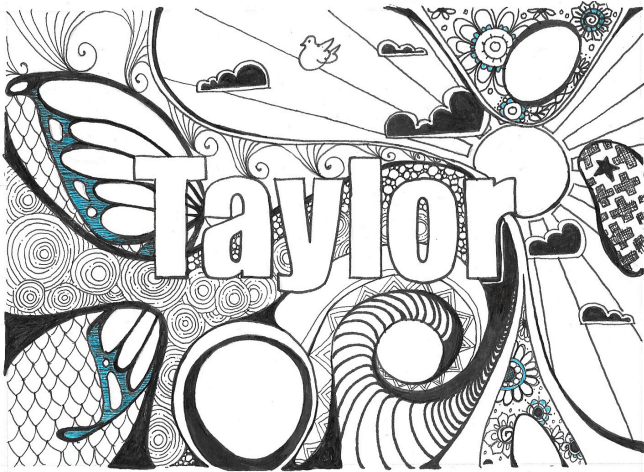
